Some of the apps that come with your phone can be safely removed without causing stability issues. They take up space and use resources that could be used for other things. Removing unwanted apps will make your phone run faster and smoother, plus, you can configure it just they way you want it.

Below is a chart that shows what apps come pre-installed on your CyanogenMod Phone. You can delete any app that shows 'yes' under 'safe to delete'; However, **if you delete an app, you will no longer be able to use its functionality** until you reinstall it.

For example, You can remove the Browser.apk and HTMLViewer.apk and the phone will be perfectly stable and will work just fine as a phone, but you will no longer be able to surf the Internet from your phone. If you never use your phone to surf the web, it would be perfectly safe for you to remove these two files.

Some of these files are needed during the install process, but are not needed afterwards, so it is better (and easier) to delete these files after installing CM (instead of deleting the files out of the .zip and re-signing it).

Backup apks

You should back up any apks that you plan to remove. That way, you can easily re-install them if you change your mind. You have two main options:

1. Nandroid backup from the recovery console, or
2. Manual backup from adb:

```
adb pull /system/app/ ~/Desktop/app/
```

How to delete/uninstall applications

To completely uninstall an application and its data, you need to execute two commands:

```
rm -f /{data,system}/app/<apkname>.apk  
pm uninstall <apkname>
```

To execute commands on the Android, you can either use adb from the PC/Mac,
wiki.cyanogenmod.com/.../Barebones

```
adb shell <command>
```

or a terminal application directly on the device (just type the command). Beware that the Terminal application in CyanogenMod won't let you type digits (<http://code.google.com/p/cyanogenmod/issues/detail?id=734>) using the Android keyboard. As a workaround, you can connect via SSH, or use [androidscrcast](http://code.google.com/p/androidscrcast/) (<http://code.google.com/p/androidscrcast/>).

Note that some applications are in `/system/app`, and others are in `/data/app`.

/system/app/

Before deleting apps from `/system`, you need to remount it in read/write mode:

```
adb remount
```

-Or-

```
mount -o rw,remount /system
```

Then, run the two commands, prefixed with `adb shell`, if you're launching them the computer:

```
rm -f /system/app/<apkname>.apk
pm uninstall <apkname>
```

***Google apps.** Strictly speaking, these apps are not necessarily needed for the phone to work, however, these apps are tightly integrated with Google branded Android, and removing them could cause stability issues.

****TtsService.apk.** This app is safe to remove, however, it is needed for speech for Google Navigation. Google Nav will work fine without it - just no voice directions.

/data/app/

To delete:

```
rm -f /data/app/<apkname>.apk
pm uninstall <apkname>
```

Restore apks

Change your mind? No problem! You have two options, depending on how you backed up your files:

1. Restore your Nandroid backup from the recovery console, or
2. Manually restore your missing apks:

```
adb install ~/Desktop/app/[appname].apk
```
